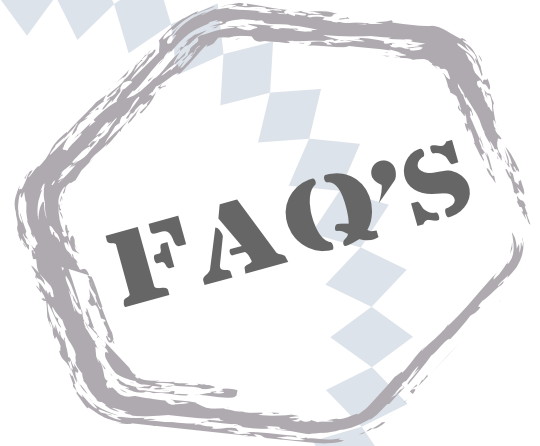


EMT COURSE

Curriculum and Course Delivery

- ▶ Follows SD EMT course curriculum allowing students to test with the National Registry of EMT's
- ▶ Live EMT lectures that can be viewed anytime
- ▶ Online learner application from textbook publisher allows for a variety of resources during the course
- ▶ Didactic/Textbook learning involve:
 - Weekly quizzes, modular exams, midterm, and a final exam
- ▶ Skills Learning involves:
 - Practical skills introduced in class lectures
 - Three skill lab sessions on Saturdays (8 hours/session):
 - One Saturday per month-Sept/Oct/Nov
 - One 12-hour observation day in the Emergency Department
 - Final Skills exam- National Registry Psychomotor Skills Exam

Dual Credit

- ▶ High School credit:
 - Elective-Just like any other electives course offered in high school
 - CTE credit- Taught by a professional field educator within the industry

 - Every South Dakota public university will award four college credits upon display of your NREMT Certification Card to the Registrar Office
