ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND DUAL CREDIT

Vermillion High School had 73 students take advanced placement classes during the past school year. Of that number, 42 students enrolled in the concurrent credit option offered through Mt. Marty College. Concurrent credit denotes college credit granted for a high school course in which the course syllabus is approved by the post-secondary institution and the instructor is certified as adjunct faculty at the institution.

For many years, Vermillion High School has offered students traditional dual-credit opportunities in a number of courses, in which the student attends the class on campus, paying full tuition and fees for the course. These courses were provided through our close association with the University of South Dakota as well as other colleges and post-secondary institutions. In addition, through the SDDOE and SDBOR "dual credit for reduced tuition" program, both online and on-campus courses are available to students at a number of institutions at a reduced tuition cost of \$48.33 per credit hour. In addition, concurrent credit courses may be offered at the school site for college credit. Students must receive a passing grade in an approved college-level course taught by a teacher with a minimum of a master's degree in their specialized field. Twenty-five students took multiple courses each semester.

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Vermillion has provided state approved technical course offerings in art, business, technology, family and consumer science, and industrial technology.

Vermillion school initiatives have changed regarding the preparation of students in career and technical education. Vermillion continues to add internship opportunities and has partnered with local contractors to increase building trades opportunities.

ALTERNATIVE HIGH SCHOOL CLASSROOM AND ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE ADDITION

In May of 2020 the Vermillion School District broke ground on a 6000 square foot addition to the high school. The addition will house an alternative classroom space which will serve students in credit recovery or taking alternative classes outside of the traditional high school experience. This alternative classroom was located off of the school district campus until 2019 when it was moved to any empty, but crowded space at the high school. This larger and more improved space will be used for years to come to serve students of Vermillion High School.

Other important additions located within this project include new administrative offices for the district's Business Office. That office was previously located in a building downtown. Bringing the Business Office to campus will allow for streamlined services and the reduction of leasing a building downtown.

A third highlight of this addition is the added security vestibule to the high school entrance. All visitors reporting to the high school will be required to go through the new administrative offices at the east entrance which allows students or visitors to be greeted and screened prior to entrance into the high school.

These improvements along with additional meeting rooms and storage space will provide more opportunities for the district to work efficiently at the new on campus location. The school board and school staff are excited for the opening of the facility in December 2020.

The South Dakota Department of Education maintains financial information of school districts on a year-to-year basis. One area of financial information that is maintained by DOE is the cost to educate a child each year which includes general fund and some funding in the capital outlay area. The latest information presented by the Department of Education is 2019-20. During this school year the Department of Education determined that it cost \$8,678 to educate one child in the Vermillion School District. This amount ranks 118 out of the total 149 school districts in South Dakota which indicates that the cost to educate a child in the Vermillion District is less than 117 other districts in the state during the 2019-20 school year.

VERMILLION SCHOOL'S TRADITION OF SUCCESS

As we enter the 2020-21 school year the Vermillion Schools continue to be progressive and innovative in delivering educational services and opportunities to our students. Vermillion School's tradition of success has been primarily due to the outstanding people that make up our school district.

Student enrollment continues to be steady, currently slated at 1258 students K-12. We also offer services for early childhood and preschool programs. Providing rigorous curriculum and diverse course offerings that challenge and prepare our youth remains the commitment of the District.

Our students strive to do their very best whether in the classroom or participating in activities. Our parents and community members provide exceptional support necessary to inspire our students and the resources to make sure our students have a broad range of experiences. We are blessed to have unique partnerships with our local hospital, City, VPSF, and University to name a few. The community involvement and business partnerships we cultivate help develop programs and opportunities that promote educational excellence and inclusion. One partnership with VPSF allows extra dollars for staff professional development.

Of our graduating 2020 seniors, over 72% went on to further their education at a post-secondary institution. Scholarships totaling more than \$1.1 million were awarded to many of these students. Our ACT score of seniors continues to be better than the State average. This year's composite score was 22.7. Vermillion students historically have done well on the Smarter Balanced Assessment. Previous data has revealed that our students are performing ahead of the State average as well as many comparable school districts, in virtually all grades and subject areas.

Vermillion Schools are also focused on preparing students to be college, career, and life ready. There is an extensive offering of advanced placement and dual credit classes as well as a variety of career and technical education classes. Both pathways offer students options and provide them with courses that are geared towards student's futures.




STATE ASSESSMENT REPORT

The South Dakota Department of Education currently administers standardized assessments in Math and English Language Arts (ELA) in grades 3-8 and 11, and Science in grades 5, 8, and 11. Math and ELA assessments are administered through the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC). Currently the Science assessment continues to be the Dakota Step (DSTEP) assessment. Vermillion School students continue to rank above the state average on the SBAC assessment.


