

Registration for 2023-24 is here!

It's the time of year when, at least at VHS, we begin to look at the year ahead and what changes that might bring to the building. Of course, there is still much to do to bring 2022-23 to a successful conclusion, but looking ahead to course registration for our students for 2023-24, here are some considerations.

Your student's overall 4-year plan is the primary focus of Ms. Suing and Mr. Hayes, our VHS School Counselors. Mr. Hayes primarily works with the beginning of the alphabet (A-K) and Ms. Suing the end of the alphabet (L-Z). However, either can answer your questions and work with your student.

The 2023-24 school year will see the return of a few courses that are on a rotational schedule. In social studies, that means the return of the very popular course History of *Ancient Greece and Rome* as well as their new *Great Plains History* which debuted this year. The English Language Arts staff will return the course *Film as Literature* as an elective offering while the collaborative Business and Art offering of *Visual Media and Marketing* will be offered again. There are still a few course decisions yet to be finalized so this should not be considered the final list of what is new or being rotated in, but as of this printing, this is what is certain.

Registration for 2023-24

Scholarships

Scholarships are now available. Now is the time to have your student stop into Student Services and regularly check their email for more information. Most deadlines are in March so it's important to have your student complete, review, and submit their scholarship application before the deadline. If your student has questions about scholarships and/or would like assistance with completing a scholarship application, please have them stop into student services. If your student needs a recommendation for their application, please remind them to ask for those recommendations as soon as possible so it allows people time to prepare them.

FAFSA

The 2023-2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available now!. FAFSA can provide your student with grants, loans, and work study funds from the Federal Government. It is best to get it done early since some of the funds are available on a first come first served basis. For a short video on how to fill out the FAFSA form, please click <u>here</u>. To fill out your FAFSA form, please visit <u>the FAFSA website</u>. Please contact student services if you have questions about filling out the FAFSA or your student would like help in filling out the FAFSA.

What are the deadlines for filling out the FAFSA form?

To be considered for federal student aid for the 2023-24 award year, you can complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form between Oct. 1, 2022, and 11:59 p.m. Central time (CT) on June 30, 2023.





Any FAFSA form corrections or updates must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. CT on Sept. 10, 2023. However, many states and colleges have earlier deadlines for applying for state and institutional financial aid, use Find your state's deadline. Check with your college or career school about its deadlines. Because of the variation in state and college deadlines, it's highly recommended that you fill out the FAFSA form as soon as you can after Oct. 1 to ensure that you don't miss out on available aid.¹

Tutor Club provides daily snacks, homework help, and fun and engaging activities, all at zero cost to families! Tutor Club can also provide transportation services at the end of the day to ensure all

members get home safely.

Tutor Club is held Monday-Friday, 3:30-5:30 in Vermillion High School (room 16). As a member, students are expected to attend daily unless involved in school activities or are working some weekday, in which case a mutually beneficial schedule can be worked out.
