Vermillion School District's newest school should be completed by mid-July of 2024, allowing about a month to move classrooms desks, books, materisls, and other items into the new space. The 117,00 square foot building will become home for pre-school through fifth grades. Both Austin and Jolley will be vacated and given to community partners (Austin to Boys & Girls Club and Jolley to the city) for the benefit of the community.




VERMILLION SCHOOL'S TRADITION OF SUCCESS




