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What is Orientation & What Does My Student Bring?

Grade-level orientation has three parts, each lasting. The schedule is as follows:

- 10:00am 11:30am VHS Auditorium for all incoming 9th grade students
 Note the date and time change.
- o 11:30am 12:15pm VHS Auditorium for all incoming 10th grade students
- o 1:30pm 2:30pm VHS Auditorium for all incoming 11th grade students
- o 2:45pm 3:45pm VHS Auditorium for all incoming 12th grade students
- Meet in the auditorium with principals, counselors and a few teachers at the start.
 - Quick introductions of key staff and their roles
 - Updates and reminders about building expectations and any changes from last year.
- Tanager Time (Homeroom)
 - Receive locker assignments
 - Turn in payments

 Computers will only be issued to students who have paid their \$25.00 computer use fee and settled any previously owed damage fees. Invoices for damage to machines last year were mailed home in May.

It is very important that your student attends the appropriate grade-level orientation and is on-time. FAFSA

What are the deadlines for filling out the FAFSA® form?

Federal Deadlines

2023-24 Academic Year

The FAFSA form must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. CT on June 30, 2024. Any corrections or updates must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. CT on Sept. 14, 2024.



College Deadlines

Each college may have its own deadline. Check with the college(s) you're interested in attending. You may also want to ask your college about its definition of an application deadline. Is it the date your FAFSA form is processed or the date the college receives your processed FAFSA data?

However, many states and colleges have earlier deadlines for applying for state and institutional financial aid. Check with your college or career school about its deadlines. Because of the variation in state and college deadlines, it's highly recommended that you fill out the FAFSA form as soon as you can after Oct. 1 to ensure that you don't miss out on available aid.1

Reminders:

1. Contact Information

Have you changed your address, phone number or email address recently? What about a guardianship change. Please help us keep you in-the-know by updating your contact information at school, as well! Messages such as school reach messaging, emergency calls and even teacher communications home are made more difficult if we do not have accurate contact information.

2. Summer Gym Access

Parents & students are reminded that summer gym access must be under the supervision of a coach, staff member or Parks & Recreation personnel as part of an authorized P & R program. The gyms and weight rooms are not available for unsupervised use or play. Unauthorized gym or facility access creates a liability concern for the school district.

3. Summer Office Hours

The VHS office is only staffed from 8:30am to 1:00 pm, Monday through Thursday, each week. Regular office hours resume July 31st.
