You may be starting to hear about a multifaceted project we've dubbed "TransformED" that brings to Vermillion a community-centered, schoolwide design project modeled on a similar project in Finland. This project comes about as the result of two VHS staff members who joined numerous educators from around the United States, Canada and other European countries in Finland, last March.

The project focuses on concepts of the design circle as well as breaking down barriers in education. With a focus on the development of 21st Century Skills, School Collaboration and School Partnerships. The



project has the benefit of taking learning beyond the traditional look and feel. By allowing younger students to work side-by-side with older students, there is a natural mentor and leader partnership that begins to form. The limitless creativity of youth combined with measured practicality from the more mature student brings together an approach to a problem that allows all involved to see things in a new way.

While the project will take a couple hours each month for the first few months of the school year, we are hopeful to see an end result that is something in which the entire community can be proud. Finland's schools are renowned for their forward thinking, but practical approaches to education. We believe that being willing to examine problems differently will help provide our students with an advantage over their educational peers.

Stay tuned for more on the "TransformED" project - a Vermillion Schools partnership with St. Agnes Elementary and the community of Vermillion. We believe exciting things are yet to come!

Celebrating Our Community!

On Wednesday, September 13th, Megan Red Shirt Shaw, Director of Native American Student Services, USD, Dr. John Little, Native Recruitment and Alumni Engagement Services, USD, and Jan Stalling, Native American Liaison for the Vermillion School District are co-hosting an event called "Celebrating our Community" – a Native American focused resource fair, FREE food courtesy of Heck's BBQ, and an evening of performances with Frank Waln and Kobe Jordan in Vermillion, South Dakota.

Representing the Lakota Nation, Frank Waln is a multi-genre music artist, public speaker, and curator from the Rosebud Reservation in South Dakota. He received a BA in Audio Arts



& Acoustics from Columbia College Chicago where he was given the Mayor's Award for Civic Engagement at graduation.

Frank Waln uses his platform and work to speak out on injustices in the US and colonization of Native land and communities. His music is a fusion of multiple genres expressed through Lakota instruments, language and electronic music production creating a unique sound rooted in a culture that is older than America itself. Frank Waln's performance style is rooted in the Lakota tradition of storytelling which helped him carve out a unique space within Indian Country and the music industry at large.

Frank Waln has received several national awards, artist fellowships and residencies for his work including three Native American Music Awards, NDN Collective's Radical Imagination Fellowship and the Native Arts and Cultures Foundation Artist Fellowship. Frank Waln has performed and presented in museums and art institutions around the world including the Smithsonian National Museum of the American Indian, the Linden Museum in Germany and the Kennedy Center. Frank Waln has appeared on radio and television for his work including MTV, ESPN, Al Jazeera, and NPR.

As a curator, Frank Waln designed a music interactive space in the new Native American Exhibition Hall at the Field Museum in Chicago. Frank Waln was recently commissioned by Harvard University's Committee on the Arts to curate a living memorial on campus to honor his great grandmother who was a survivor of Indian boarding schools. Frank Waln's music is available on all streaming platforms.

Kobe Jordan is a Native American singer/songwriter from Vermillion, SD, a graduate of Vermillion High School and is now based in Sioux Falls, SD. He is dedicated to creating music that sparks a familiar feeling, emotion, or memory. In a synthesis of styles fusing 80's tinged guitars with modern pop, Kobe presents tunes that elicit feelings of love and heartbreak, triumph, and tragedy. With stories in the form of songs, he wishes to share what he has learned with his listeners. After getting the opportunity to perform on the Levitt Stage last summer, he is ready to take the stage again to share the latest music that he finally feels is genuine pieces of himself.

The Benefits of School Activities Participation



Extracurricular activities continue to play an important role in student's lives. More than 10 million students nationwide participate in high school activities. As a result of these activities students learn life skills that would not otherwise be taught in the classroom. The National Federation of State High School Associations identifies several benefits to school activities.

Sportsmanship and citizenship are valuable behaviors learned in school activities. Students that are involved in activities are more likely to graduate, have a higher-grade point average, have better attendance, have fewer discipline problems, and more likely to demonstrate self-discipline. They develop both emotional and physical well-being. The community also benefits. Through community pride and spirit, rapport is established between adults and students along with overall camaraderie.

The goal of school activities in the Vermillion School District is considered part of the school's program of education. It provides experiences that will help promote health and well-being, academic success, character, and life skills. What are the deadlines for filling out the FAFSA® form?

Federal Deadlines

2023-24 Academic Year

The FAFSA form must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. CT on June 30, 2024. Any corrections or updates must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. CT on Sept. 14, 2024.

College Deadlines

Each college may have its own deadline. Check with the college(s) you're interested in attending. You may also want to ask your college about its definition of an application deadline. Is it the date your FAFSA form is processed or the date the college receives your processed FAFSA data?

However, many states and colleges have earlier deadlines for applying for state and institutional financial aid. Check with your college or career school about its deadlines. Because of the variation in state and college deadlines, it's highly recommended that you fill out the FAFSA form as soon as you can after Oct. 1 to ensure that you don't miss out on available aid.¹
