

### FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form is normally available in October of each year, but the 2024-25 FAFSA form will not be available until sometime in December 2023. They are working on making some major changes and improvements to simplify the process for students and parents when filling out the form. Changes to the FAFSA form for the 2024-25 aid year include expanded eligibility for federal student aid and a more streamlined application process. There is not a definitive launch date set yet, but when there is, the VHS Student Services office will communicate the date with senior students and parents.

### 2023-24 Academic Year

The FAFSA form must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. CT on June 30, 2024. Any corrections or updates must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. CT on Sept. 14, 2024.

### **College Deadlines**

Each college may have its own deadline. Check with the college(s) you're interested in attending. You may also want to ask your college about its definition of an application deadline. Is it the date your FAFSA form is processed or the date the college receives your processed FAFSA data?

However, many states and colleges have earlier deadlines for applying for state and institutional financial aid. Check with your college or career school about its deadlines. Because of the variation in state and college deadlines, it's highly recommended that you fill out the FAFSA form as soon as you can after Oct. 1 to ensure that you don't miss out on available aid.1
